YEAR WISE ACTIVITIES OF ŚAṆKARADEVA

- 1449 A.D.—Śaṅkaradeva was born at Bardowa in modern Nagaon district of Assam
- 1450 A.D.—Śaṅkaradeva's grandfather Suryabar died
- 1451 A.D.— Śaṅkaradeva's step brother Bangayā was born
- 1454 A.D.— Śaṅkaradeva was given *Uttarī*
- 1457 A.D.—Kusumbar Bhuyan died
- 1461 A.D.— Śaṅkaradeva's education started under Mahendra Kandali
- 1466 A.D.— Śaṅkaradeva completed education
- 1468 A.D.—(i) Śaṅkaradeva established first *Kīrtan Ghar* at Bardowa (ii) *Cihna Yātrā* was enacted
- 1470 A.D.— Śaṅkaradeva married Suryavati
- 1472 A.D.—Birth of Suryavati's daughter Manu
- 1473 A.D.—Death of Suryavati
- 1480 A.D.—Manu married to Hari Bhuyan
- 1481 A.D.— (i)Śaṅkaradeva started first pilgrimage (ii) Composition of 1st *Bargīta* '*Rāma meri hṛdaya pañkaje raise...*'
- 1489 A.D.—(i) Arrived at Badarikashram (ii) Composition of 2nd *Bargīta* '*Mana meri rāma caraṇahi lāgu*' (iii) Birth of Mādhavadeva
- 1493 A.D.— Śaṅkaradeva returned from pilgrimage
- 1503 A.D.— Śaṅkaradeva married Kālindī
- 1509 A.D.— Śaṅkaradeva established Bardowa *Thān*
- 1516 A.D.— Śaṅkaradeva left Bardowa and arrived at Rowta
- 1517 A.D.— Śaṅkaradeva arrived at Gangmou
- 1522 A.D.—(i) Śaṅkaradeva arrived at Komorakata (ii) Arrival at Maluwalarati
(iii) Birth of Rāmānanda (iv) Arrival at Dhuwahata (v) Initiation of Mādhavadeva
- 1524 A.D.—Birth of second son Kamalalocana
- 1526 A.D.—Birth of third son Haricarana
- 1528 A.D.—Birth of daughter Rukminī
- 1536 A.D.—Allegation by Brahmin priests and trial by king Chuhungmung
- 1539 A.D.—Allegation by Brahmin priests to king Chuklenmung
- 1540 A.D.—(i) elephant safari of king Chuklenmung (ii) Arrest of Mādhavadeva (iii) Execution of Hari (iv) Release of Mādhavadeva (v) Departure from Dhuwahata (vi) Arrival at Kapalabari
- 1541 A.D.—(i) Śaṅkaradeva arrived at Cunporā (ii) Initiation of Nārāyana Dās Ṭhākura (Bhavānanda)
(iii) Śaṅkaradeva arrived at Kumārkuchi (iv) Death of Rukminī

- 1542 A.D.—(i) Śaṅkaradeva arrived at Patbausi (ii) Arrival of King Naranārāyaṇa at Barnagar (iii) Initiation of Kachari king of Heramdoi (near Palashbari)
- 1543 A.D.—Śaṅkaradeva met Naranārāyaṇa at Barnagar
- 1545 A.D.—Capital of Koch Kingdom shifted to Dinganagar
- 1546 A.D.—(i) Cilārāi attacked Āhom Kingdom (ii) Dāmodardeva migrated to Koch Kingdom
- 1547 A.D.—Cilārāi became acting king
- 1548 A.D.—(i) Cilārāi became disciple of Śaṅkaradeva (ii) Dāmodardeva met Śaṅkaradeva
- 1550 A.D.—(i) Dāmodardeva became disciple of Śaṅkaradeva (ii) Set for second pilgrimage
- 1551 A.D.— Śaṅkaradeva returned from pilgrimage
- 1552 A.D.—(i) Allegation by Brahmin priests to Naranārāyaṇa (ii) Arrest of Nārāyaṇa Dās Ṭhākura and Gakula Cānda (iii) Arrival of Śaṅkaradeva in Cilārāi's house (iv) Arrival of Śaṅkaradeva in the court of Naranārāyaṇa (v) Visit of Mādhavadeva in Banduka (vi) Cāndsāi became disciple (vii) Composition of *Guṇamālā*
- 1554 A.D.—Making of *Vṛndāvanī-Vastra*
- 1555 A.D.— *Vṛndāvanī-Vastra* given to Naranārāyaṇa
- 1568 A.D.—(i) Naranārāyaṇa wanted to be a disciple (ii) Composition and enactment of the last play *Śrī Rāma Bijaya* (iii) Passing away of Śaṅkaradeva
