I am delighted to welcome all of them to this University named after the great Saint Srimanta Sankaradeva, the great champion of spirituality, humanism and universal brotherhood.

I am glad to share that the University strived very well in its first and second academic years in fulfilment of its main aim to provide holistic education. Being aware of the fact that most of the faculty members of this University are young, a good number of eminent Professor from the Central and State Universities of the North East India were invited as Visiting Professors, so that the students become more benefitted by the faculties. ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

Introduction:

Mahapurusha Srimanta Sankaradeva (1449-1568) was a multi-dimensional genius, who transformed and modernized Assamese society with his egalitarian ideology. He worked in diverse fields like religion, literature, music, dance, drama, architecture, social reconstruction, etc. He translated most part of the Bhâgavata Mahapurana into Assamese language and was the first ever playwright in any Indian language other than Sanskrit. He wrote more than 26 (twenty six) scriptures mostly in Assamese language besides the Brajawali form and one in Sanskrit. In addition he had composed many lyrics/songs including the Borgeets. All these justify to call him SARVAGUNAKARA by his most loyal disciple Madhabadeva. His philosophy too was unique and different from other branches of Hindu philosophies. Above all he was a humanist. He welcomed every one irrespective of caste, creed, sex into his order. He was also a pioneer in adult education, mass communication, etc. He called upon the society to educate women and the downtrodden people.

Srimanta Sankaradeva founded a new school of art. He initiated a new form of painting with his epochmaking drama-festival Chihna-Yâtrâ held in 1468 A.D. where he drew the imaginary pictures of heaven to be used as backdrops. He encouraged illustration of his manuscripts with pictorial depiction of stories from the Bhâgavata. The Nâmghar founded by him has become a multi-dimensional institution and symbol of Assamese society. He visited many places of the Indian subcontinent and his impact was clearly felt in those regions, be it Yâtrâ of Bengal, scroll painting of Odisha, plays of Mithila, etc.



Srimanta Sankaradeva Sangha was set up in 1930 in order to carry forward the reforms initiated by the saint. It is the largest NGO in North East India and it has been working relentlessly among the masses for inculcating the values preached by Srimanta Sankaradeva. It is running several schools in the state to spread value based education. The Sangha envisaged to establish a University and authorised its Srimanta Sankaradeva Education and Socio-Economic Development Trust, Nagaon to sponsor the establishment of the University. The Sangha submitted a proposal to the Government of Assam for establishment of the University under the Assam Private Universities Act, 2007. The Assam Legislative Assembly passed 'The Mahapurusha Srimanta Sankaradeva Viswavidyalaya Act, 2013'. The Act of the Assam Legislative Assembly (Assam Act No. XIX of 2013) received the assent of the Hon'ble Governor of Assam vide: No. LGL.59/2013/16 and notified it in the Assam Gazette No. 351 dated 14th August, 2013.

The newly set up Mahâpurusha Srimanta Sankaradeva Viswavidyâlaya has formally been founded on 10th June, 2014. Though the University has been set up under the Private University Act, but it is designed as a people's university, an institution for the entire people





of Assam as well as India. It is located at Nagaon, the place blessed with the dust of the saint's feet for more than half a century, since he lived half of his life at Bardowa, Nagaon. The Mahâpurusha Srimanta Sankaradeva Viswavidyâlaya fraternity firmly believes that a new era of social regeneration will start from this University.

Important Information:

- (i) The University Grants Commission (UGC) vide letter No. F.8-26/2014 (CPP-1/PU) dated 17 December, 2014 has informed that "in view of the establishment of Mahapurusha Srimanta Sankaradeva Viswavidyalaya (MSSV), Srimanta Sankaradeva Sangha Complex, Haladhar Bhuyan Path, Kalongpar, Nagaon-782001, Assam by State Act, the name of the University has been included in the list maintained by the UGC on its website www.ugc.ac.in"
- (ii) The Assistant Director, Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Human Resource Development (vide communication dated, 29th February, 2016) has informed that Mahapurusha Srimanta Sankaradeva Viswavidyalaya has been added in their list as State University and allotted an ID—0812 for All India Survey on Higher Education (AISHE), Ministry of HRD w.e.f. 2014-15.
- (iii) The National Scholarship Portal of the Department of Electronic & Information Technology, Ministry of Communications & IT, Govt. of India has added Mahapurusha Srimanta Sankaradeva Viswavidyalaya in its University Data Base List. Students of MSSV can now apply to various scholarship Schemes of Govt. of India.

Academic Aspects:

The Mahapurusha Srimanta Sankaradeva Viswavidyalaya, Nagaon in its first academic session (2014-15) established the Departments of Assamese, Computer Application, Education, Sankaradeva Studies and Sociology. The University in its second academic year (2015-16) along with the existing five Departments introduced three other departments namely, Departments of Juridical Studies, Department of Social Work and Department of Yogic Science & Naturopoathy. In the forthcoming academic year (2016-2017) the University has completed all preparation for establishing the Department of English.

M.Phil. and Ph.D. programmes in Sankaradeva Studies are going on in the Department of Sankaradeva Studies and Ph.D. programme in Assamese is going on in the Department of Assamese.

Semester System:

All programmes in the University are run in the Semester System. Stress is laid down on continuous evaluation. 20% of marks in each course/paper have been earmarked for internal assessment.

The post-graduate programmes consist of four semesters and one year programmes consist of two semesters. The First and Third Semesters of the programmes start from 1st July (however, classes start from 1st August) of every calendar year. The Second and Fourth Semesters start from 1st January (however, classes start from 1st February) of every subsequent calendar year.





Infrastructure available at present:

The offices and classes have been arranged in the three storeyed R.C.C. building in the Srimanta Sankaradeva Sangha Complex, Kalongpar, Nagaon with the following infrastructure:

Classrooms:

Hygienic classrooms with comfortable seating have been arranged. All classrooms are fitted with eco-friendly boards and LCD projectors.

Computer Laboratory:

A well designed Computer Laboratory having capacity for 25 students at a time has been established.



Internet Centre:

An Internet Centre with a capacity for 20 students at a time shall be arranged, so that the students can access information through ICT.

Library:

The University has a rich library with thousands of books of various branches of knowledge. Students are allowed to borrow books from the library. Provision has also been made for a Reading Room in a well ventilated location.



Canteen:

There is a provision for the University Canteen, where the students shall be able to have lunch / tiffin in a hygienic condition

Auditorium:

An auditorium of medium size is available with a large stage where the students can organise cultural events and functions.







Boys' and Girls' Common Room (Separately):

Provisions have been made for Boys' Common Room and Girls' Common Room separately so that they can take rest on leisure time. Some items of indoor games have been arranged in the Common Rooms. Besides, separate lavatories have also been arranged for boys

and girls.

Sports & Games:

As the University in its present campus has no sufficient space for arranging sports and games, permission from the Nagaon District Sports Association has been obtained to use the Indoor Stadium and the famous Nurul Amin Stadium of Nagaon, as and when required.

The students of the first academic year (2014-15) organised the 1st 'Varsity Week' and the students of the second academic year



(2015-2016) organised the 2nd 'Varsity Week', MSSV, Nagaon. Various literary, cultural and sports events were organized during the 'Varsity Week.' Friendly Cricket Matches of the Students vs Teachers-Officers & Employees of the University were played on the inaugural days of the 'Varsity Weeks and Cultural Evenings were organised on the concluding days.

Parking facilities:

Space has been arranged near the University Campus for parking the vehicles, bikes, scooty, etc. of the students coming from distant places.

Students' Aid Fund:

A fund has been created out of the fees collected from the students under the head 'Students' Aid Fund'. Really needy students shall be identified and the fund shall be distributed among them.



Concession of Fee: Concession of fees may be considered to meritorious students belonging to Below Poverty Line (BPL) families on production of appropriate certificate.

Measures for Students' Empowerment:

Various activities, viz., seminars, symposia, inspirational lectures are very frequently organised for the students of the University.





In the first academic year several seminars, symposia at regional and national level and talks were organised by the University in collaboration with some organisations. In the second academic year such academic activities were increased for providing on academically vibrant atmosphere in the University.

The Department of Education, MSSV, Nagaon in collaboration with the Common Wealth Council for Educational Administration and Management, Canada, Assam Affiliate organised an International Seminar on 8th, 9th and 10th October, 2015 on the theme of "Holistic Education for a Better World." A cultural programme was organised on the occasion.





A programme on "Loka: The Many Voices— Puppet Play of Assam" was organised on 25th November, 2015. The programme started with an Inaugural cum Lecture programme. Prof. P. C. Das, Department of Folklore Studies of Gauhati University as well as a renowned scholar in the field of Folklore Studies. After the talk a puppet play was displayed by the puppet artists of the Mohkholi Putola Nach Somity, Nalbari.

The **Constitution Day** was celebrated on 26th November, 2015 by the Department of Juridical Studies, MSSV, Nagaon to mark a tribute to Dr. B. R. Ambedkar. This programme was attended by the students and faculty members of all departments as well as the staff of the university. Mr. Debasish Bhattacharya, Additional District and Session Judge, Nagaon Court, was the chief guest of the programme.

The students along with some teachers, officers and employees of the University in collaboration with Srimanta Sankaradeva Sanga performed the "Ram Bijoy", bhaona of Srimanta Sankaradeva at Sankaradeva Kalakhetra, Guwahati on 9th January, 2016 and the same drama was performed at the 85th Annual Conference of the Srimanta Sankaradeva Sangha held on 5th February, 2016 at Sivasagar.





The Department of Education, Sociology and Social Work jointly celebrated the **International Women's Day** on 8th March, 2016.

Seminars by the students are a regular activity. To make it more effective the 2nd Inter-Departmental Seminar Presentation Competition on a common topic on "Development of North East—Challenges and Opportunities" was organised among the students of the University on 17th and 18th May, 2016. Altogether twelve prizes were offered to the best competitors in the various categories.





Students' Counselling & Guidance Cell:

To offer proper counselling to the students to face the various challenges confronted by them and also to guide them to achieve the desired goals, a Counselling & Guidance Cell comprising of the teachers and officers has been formed. A Workshop on "Empowering for Employment" was organised on 14th May, 2016. Dr. Binod Borah, Deputy Registrar (Academic), Dibrugarh University and Mr. Arinjit Hazarika, Academic Officer, Dibrugarh University acted as the Resource Persons.

Department of Yoga Science organised 'Yoga Fest-2016' as per the guidelines of the UGC. The Programme basically comprises of lectures, demonstrations, etc. The Programme was held from 3rd to 20th May, 2016. All the students, research scholars, teachers, faculty members, officers participated in the Yoga Fest Programme.

Training & Placement Cell:

A Training & Placement Cell has been formed in the University to provide training to the students at regular intervals to help them to be successful in getting jobs or starting entrepreneurial activities by themselves. The Cell shall also assist the students in getting information regularly regarding availability of job in the various enterprises.





Grievance Redressal Cell:

A Grievance Redressal Cell has been formed to address the grievance of the students, if any, and take up measures promptly.

Prohibition of Ragging:

Top vigilance is maintained to ensure that ragging of any form does not take place in the University campus. Rules, as laid down by the University Grants Commission or other relevant bodies are strictly followed by the University administration. Measures to create awareness among the students against ragging are taken earnestly. As prevention is better than cure, the following points are brought to the attention of the prospective students and their parents/guardians. The students admitted to the University shall have to submit Affidavits of their own and parents or guardians after careful perusal of the following:

WHAT CONSTITUTES RAGGING:

One or more of any of the following acts constitute(s) Ragging:

- (a) any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student;
- (b) indulging in rowdy or indisciplined activities by any student or students which cause or are likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student;
- (c) asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student;
- (d) any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher;
- (e) exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- (f) any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students;
- (g) any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;

(h)



any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student;

any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.



VIII. Department of Yogic Science & Naturopathy

Name of the programme: Post Graduate Diploma in Yogic Science (PGDYSc.)

Eligibility for Admission: (i) Bachelor degree holder from a recognised University with at least 45% marks; (ii) Must be physically and mentally sound to undergo intense practical training in all yoga practices. ADMISSION PROCEDURE

How to obtain Admission Forms/Information Brochures:

Candidates for admission to the programmes are to apply in the prescribed form only (attached with Information Brochure). The Information Brochure can be obtained from the Office of the MSSV, Nagaon on payment of Rs. 500/- in Cash or Bank Draft in favour of Mahapurusha Srimanta Sankaradeva Viswavidyalaya, Payable at State Bank of India, Main Branch, Nagaon. Forms can also be obtained by post by sending a Bank Draft of Rs. 500/- along with a self addressed stamped envelope of 25 cm x 30 cm size to the Assistant Registrar (Academic), Mahapurusha Srimanta Sankaradeva Viswavidyalaya, Srimanta Sankaradeva Sangha Complex, Haladhar Bhuyan Path, Kalongpar, Nagaon-782001.



The University administration shall, however, not be responsible for non-delivery / late delivery of forms sent by post. Forms downloaded from the website: www.mssv.co.in shall also be accepted, provided it is submitted along with a Bank Draft of Rs. 500/-.



SUBMISSION OF FILLED IN ADMISSION FORMS:

The prescribed application forms shall have to be completed in all respects. Incomplete forms shall be rejected. The completed forms along with attested copies of all required testimonials are to be submitted to the Assistant Registrar (Academic), MSSV, Nagaon within the scheduled last date. Application received after the last date shall not be accepted.

SELECTION PROCEDURE:

Selection of candidates for admission shall be made on merit basis.

The list of selected candidates shall be put on the Notice Board of the University and the University's website: www.mssv.co.in. Intimation to the candidates shall not be conveyed individually. The candidates may be called for interview on the date and venue to be decided by the University.

Selected candidates shall have to get themselves admitted on the date & time as specified by the University on payment of the prescribed fee, failing which selection for admission shall automatically get cancelled.

WAITING LIST:

A programme-wise waiting list, of the candidates shall be prepared. Candidates in Waiting List may also be called for interview along with the provisionally selected candidates. Vacant seats, if any, shall be filled up from the candidates in the Waiting List. No student from the Waiting List shall, however, be admitted to any programme after 15 days from the date of commencement of classes in a Semester/Session.

CANCELLATION OF ADMISSION:

- (i) A candidate shall forfeit his/her seat, if admission is not taken on the specific date.
- (ii) A student shall also forfeit the seat, if he/she fails to attend classes without valid ground and permission of the Head of the Department concerned for consecutive 15 (fifteen) days from the date of commencement of class.
- (iii) The name of the student shall also be struck off from the Rolls of the University, if he/she is found admitted to other University / Institution during the academic session in which he/she is admitted in the University.





ADMISSION TO NEXT HIGHER SEMESTER/CLASS:

Students of all the programmes on completion of a Semester shall be admitted to next higher Semester/Class on payment of the dues within the prescribed period. They must produce the official receipt of the payment of the dues to the respective Head of the Department for record and to get their names registered in the Department.

ATTENDANCE:

All students shall attend a minimum of 85% of the total number of classes held. If the percentage of attendance does not fall below 75%, a student may be permitted to appear as a 'Non-Collegiate' student on payment of the prescribed fee.

RESERVATION AND RELAXATION FOR ADMISSION:

(i) Statutory Reservation:

Scheduled Caste (S.C.): 7%

Scheduled Tribes, Plains (S.T.P.): 10% Scheduled Tribes, Hills (S.T.H.): 5%

OBC / MOBC: 15%

NOTE: For consideration of admission under reserved categories Caste Certificates countersigned by the Deputy Commissioner of the district concerned must be produced.

(ii) Differently Abled (Physically Challenged):

3% of the total seats in each subject/programme shall be reserved for the differently abled candidates.

Candidates applying for admission under this category of reservation must submit Medical Certificate issued by the Joint Director of Health Services of the district concerned.

Candidates with negligible deficiency shall not be considered for admission under this category of reservation.





(iii) Extra Curricular Activities:

(A) SPORTS:

A total of three seats for all the programmes have been reserved for the candidates having proficiency in Extra Curricular activities as shown below. He/she must have represented the State of Assam in any one of the games conducted by the National Sports Federation or Association of Indian Universities (AIU), New Delhi as recognised by the Sports Authority of India (SAI) / Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India.



(1) Athletics (2) Badminton (3) Cricket (4) Football (5) Table Tennis (6) Weight Lifting and Best Physique (7) Volley Ball.

The candidates under this category must be below the age of 25 years on 31st July of the current calendar year. Participation in the above mentioned games and sports must not be earlier than three years before the academic session in which admission is sought.

(B) ART / CULTURE: Seats reserved: 2 Nos.

Eligibility: Proficiency in Fine Arts or Performing Arts, as evidenced by participation at the recognised Regional / National level competitions representing the State of Assam.

(C) LITERARY:

One seat in the M.A. in Assamese programme for the candidate having certificate of winning award / prizes in literary competitions of National Level or having standard published work.

(D) N.C.C.:

One seat reserved for the NCC candidates representing the State of Assam in the Republic Day Parade in New Delhi or having N.C.C. 'C' Certificate.

(E) N.S.S.:

One seat reserved for the N.S.S. volunteers who participated in Republic Day Parade at New Delhi, participated in at least one national level N.S.S. camp.

A relaxation of 5% of marks in the eligibility norms shall be allowed to the candidates considered for admission under the reservation categories.

NOTE: Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited in the University. If any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the University administration, the same shall be dealt with as per rules. Students involved in ragging may be expelled or handed over to the police, if necessary.


VISION:
